

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INTRODUCTION



- ❑ Community planning involves the participation of local community.

- ❑ Saudi Arabia planning processes have gone through several phases, and mostly without the involvement of communities and key stakeholders in the planning processes.
- ❑ This study show the relevance of engaging communities when carrying out any community development project in Saudi Arabia specifically in the South Abhur District of Jeddah city



- ❑ The Saudi Planning system does not encourage Walkability an issue observed by the study.
- ❑ Therefore, the study area has poor walkable environment despite its location close to the waterfront and good planning.
- ❑ The community members however indicated the lack of open spaces and urban streetscape elements that promote and encourage walkability.




IMPORTANCE OF THE STUDY

The southern region of Abhur is about 14,162,736 square meters



LITERATURE REVIEW

- ❑ Community development Planning is a process that engages community members in planning and implementing the long-term vision for their community (First Nation, 2014).
- ❑ It includes the development of objectives, goals and/or a plan of action to work towards fulfilling the community vision
- ❑ It helps the communities to recognize and develop a structure to improve and impact their quality of living, ultimately, making them livable, sustainable and equitable
- ❑ Participation and involvement is key to a successful community development planning.

- v. Inclusive action plan to achieve community vision




Community Planning Meeting






- ❑ Keep the locality informed, listen to their views and provide feedback on how their input influenced decision making.






- ❑ Walkability is the extent to which the built environment supports and encourages walking by providing for pedestrian comfort and safety, connecting people with varied destinations within a reasonable amount of time and effort, and offering visual interest in journeys throughout the network (Southworth, 2005).
- ❑ So, walkable neighborhood is a safe, well-serviced neighborhood, imbued with qualities that make walking a positive experience.
- ❑ It has a quality public realm that provides opportunities for interaction and exchange; it offers equitable access to goods, services, and facilities






Map of Municipal Division of Abhor.



- iii. Poor design and implementation of the street networks.




- ❑ Thermal comfort studies has shown that thermal comfort is influenced by physical, psychological, physiological, and behavioral factors:
















Proposed Areas for New Public Park.

- The questionnaire response indicated the area to be considered for the proposal of the new public facilities. The result obtained from the study indicated that the residents of the neighborhood voted as follows;
- Area 1 with a total area of 8000m² (35% Disagreed that the location is the best for Public open space while 65% agreed).
 - Area 2 with a total area of around 3870m² (48% Disagreed that the location is the best for Public open space while 52% agreed).
 - Area 3 with a total area of around 38272m² (21% Disagreed that the location is the best for Public open space while 79% agreed).
 - Area 4 with a total area of around 12500m² (36% Disagreed that the location is the best for Public open space while 64% agreed).




Selected Area for Proposed New Public Park.

 - iv. The land area the biggest in size with 38272m².



Site Plan of the Proposed Public Open Space & Park








Map Showing the Waterfront Area
